Eliminate Onerous New York State Regulations

On August 7, 2009 Governor Paterson issued Executive Order 25 (http://www.ny.gov/governor/executive_orders/xeorders/eo_25.html) calling on agencies to solicit input on existing regulations from affected businesses in an attempt to modernize the State's regulatory framework and eliminate regulations that are onerous or outdated.
